Subject: Increasing of the patient limit w.e.f. 14,08.2021- reg

In view of increasing demand by patients and decrease in number of COVID -19 case, it has been decided to increase the number of patients limit in OPD 300 to 500 patient per day w.e.f. 14.08.2021 with the following instructions.

OPD INSTRUCTION:

- RAT negative report done on the same day or two doses of vaccination are advisable for all OPD consultations, for safety of patients.
- Further this it is to be ensured/ that all should adhere to Covid appropriate* and Ayurveda appropriate behavior in Hospital premises*.
- > IPD ADMISSIONS FOR URGENT NON- COVID PATIENTS IS ALSO STARTED SUBJECT TO FOLLOWING CONDITIONS.
 - Patients with certificates of both doses of vaccination with RAT negative report of same day or RTPCR negative report within 72 hours will be mandatory for IPD admission.
 - RAT negative report (of same day) and/or certificate of two doses of vaccine is mandatory for attendants residing with the patients, both patients and attendants should adhere to Covid appropriate and Ayurveda appropriate behavior.
 - Outside food & beverages will not be allowed strictly, (floor in-charge/ staff nurse and security personnel will ensure this.). Special diet may be allowed only after recommendation of consulting Physician through RMO.
 - No visitors pass will be issued; No gate pass also will be issued, unless there is any urgency and that too as per established Protocol (Nursing staff on duty will ensure this)
 - Frequent outgoing of patient/attendant will not be permitted. (floor in-charge/ staff nurse and security personnel will ensure this.)
 - All essential procedures may be permitted both in OT, Panchakarma and other areas by adhering to Covid appropriate behavior * and Ayurveda appropriate behavior * in Hospital premises.

- Wask
- Social Distancing
- · Frequent hand washing

- F Gargle & steam inhalation
- Ayush Kwath/or Hearbal decoction intake
- Samsahavani vati/Giloy vati intake
- Nasal drops 2 drops of Anu Tail in each nostril
- Use of Chyawanprash & or any Rasayan intake as immunity booster
