Department of Prasuti Tantra and Stree Roga has taken various Innovative steps to improve the qualities standards of the facilities provided by Prasuti Tantra and Stree Roga Depatrtment.

- In order to improve the quality of Stanik Stree Roga Chikitsa, hands on training on various procedures was given to PhD and PG Scholars and Therapist on regular basis .Every 3 monthly Department of Prasuti Tantra and Stree Roga organizes Hands on Training Program of Stanik Stree Roga Chikitsa, organizes Guest lectures for Stanik Stree Roga Chikitsa, encourage our PG and PhD Scholars to attend workshops ,seminars to remain updated with current advancement in treatment modalities. All procedures are done under all aseptic precausions, All the instruments are used after proper autoclaving, Procedure Room is cleaned and fumigated regularly.
- Our Labour room and Operation Theater is well equipped with all surgical instruments and emergency kit ,24 Hours delivery and Caesarean section facility is available here. 24 hours on duty Gyanecologist is always available to provide emergrency survice to pregnant and women suffering from Gynaecological disorders. All the PG and PhD Scholars and Nursing staff is capable of managing any kind of Obstetric and Gyanecological emergency.
- Special attention is given to maintenance of hygiene, Labour Room and Operation Theater is fumigated regularly, All the procedures are strictly performed under all aseptic precausions, Before starting any procedure proper written informed consent is taken with due sign of patient and her relative, proper counselling is given to the patient about what are the treatment modalities available for your condition, what are the probable complications of these procedures .Before taking any Patient for Operative ,thorough General ,obstetrical examination is carried out , relevant investigations are carried out ,Pre Anaestetic check up is carried out ,proper documentation of each event

is recorded in case sheet and relevant Registers, after ensuring all safety then patient is shifted to OT. After operation carefully monitouring of vitals is done.

- Operating staff are regularly oriented for adequate infection control activities, including
 routine cleaning and the appropriate disposal of clinic waste. The operating room is
 cleaned after surgery, including the correct disposal of sharp objects and clinical waste
 related blood related products and cleaning of all surfaces.
- The principles of sterile aseptic technique are applied to all operating room procedures and sterile OT dress are used for the patient. Staff wear full sterile operating room personal protective clothing.
- All the procedures are monitored in real-time by Consultant and PG and PhD scholars.
 SOP's are developed and made available for all the staff working in the Prasuti Tantra and Stree Roga Department as per NABH norms. SoPs are periodically revised and amended to the institutes NABH manual.
- To improve the quality of work, Dept. of Prasuti Tantra has prepared pamphlets of various routinely observed diseased conditions, to make patient aware about do's and don'ts about the particular disease.
- To improve the quality, department is regularly organized Health check up camps
 which includes Pap Smear Test, Colposcopic Examination, Bone marrow Density
 measurement, Department regularly organizes awareness programme throughout the
 Year.
- To Improve the clinical documentation regarding the Stanik Stree Roga Chikitsa ,Delivery Record , Operative notes ,all these records is maintained in respective Registers and it is time timely checked and verified . This record includes Patient history case sheet, investigation, Preoperative preparation documents, informed consent, procedure note and post-operative order etc. of the Prasuti Tantra and Stree Roga department, we maintain Partogram of each delivering women , keep record of NST.

- To maintain quality assurance the OT, these units are under the strict supervision by the infection control nurse and the infection control team who ensures absolute sterility of the operation area to avoid the risk of transmission of infection.
- To improve the quality of care plan timely monitoring of surgical site infection rates are also taken care. All the post-operative patients are routinely screened for the same.
- To improve the quality control infection Bio Medical waste segregation is done as per the GPCB Guideline. Department is also well acquainted with hazard risk mitigation strategy and well maintained and hygiene concerns are being taken care regularly.
- The hospital infection control team is conducting regular surveillance, which includes monitoring of surgical infection site. Culture swab are taken from infected or suspected wound site to analyze them with the aim to prevent or reduce the risk of hospital associated infections.





problem statements related to Ayush health care services. A total of 372 teams participated in the program and around 1 lakh students participated in the event.


The main objectives of the program were:



Hands on Training Workshop on HPTLC Technique and its application in Drug Research 17th - 19th March, 2021

Organized by Quality Control Lab & Department of Rasashastra & Shalshaiya Kalbana All India Institute of Ayurveda, New Delhi

introduction:

Adulteration and substitution of herbal drugs has crept in due to more inclination towards herbal practices in absence or scarcity of raw materials. Therefore, standardization and quality control of Ayurvedic single drug and polyherbal formulations has gained much importance in present era. Newer tools and techniques are available now a day that felicitate the enalyst i researcher in ascertaining the genuinengss and authenticity of a marketed drug. Amongst them, the foremost is HPTLC analysis. Further, scope of HPTLC is not only limited to quality control and analysis. It has widespread application in drug research

Therefore a need was felt in the Department of RSBK to train the faculty members and PG scholars in order to acquaint them with know-how's of HPTLC analysis by organizing a "Hands on Training Workshop on HPTLC Technique and its application in Drug Research from 17th - 19th March, 2021. Two local experts from deliberated on the importance of HPTLC and M/s ANCHROM Pvt. Ltd. had provided expert on Application Specialist for the three days training program.

Brief report:

The program was inaugurated by Honible Director, AliA on 17th March, 2021 at 11:00 am in Conference Room of Academic block. The function was attended by faculty members. PG scholars of RSBK and DG departments, SRF of RRDR Project, and Pharmacy manager. Director Madam explained the need and importance for holding such hands-on training workshop. She congratulated the organizing team for making it possible to arrange the event at a short notice of time. This was followed by an expert talk by Dr. Sayeed Ahmad. Associate Professor of Pharmacognosy and Phytochemistry, Jamia Hamdard.

Day 01: 5th June: Deliberation by expert and sample preparation

The day was divided in two sessions, Prelaunch session had a presentation by Dr. Sayeed Ahmad, Associate Professor of Pharmacognosy and Phytochemistry. James Hamdard deliberated on the topic. 'Utilization of HPTLC for Quality control of Ayurvedic Herbs" He spoke on various aspects of HPTLC technique being utilized for quality control of Ayunvedic formulations, standardization, identifying substitutes, adultemats, marker compound quantification, utility in stability studies etc. The presentation was supported by published literature in various peer reviewed journals

Session if consisted of various sample preparation of PG scholars that were to be run for HPTLC analysis on next day,

Day 62: 18th March: Hands on Training and analysis

Sh Vishwajit Kale, Application Specialist ANCHROM provided the hands on training. He started with an exhaustive presentation on explaining the theoretical components of HPTLC in detail. Thereafter, he started to demonstrate the application espects of the machine to all the participants. Various parts and components of machine and their utility were explained in detail. Operations of hardware and software were also explained.

Post lunch session consisted of detailed explanation of sample preparation, mobile phase, stationary phase, sample application, visualization, derivatization etc. It was followed by calibration and IQ/OC (installation qualification).

Day 03: 19th Merch: Expert talk and training

During pre tunch session, the scholars got an opportunity to work on the HPTLC system installed in QC lab. They also analyzed few samples it was followed by celibration and IQ/OC (installation qualification and operational qualification). Calibration certificate for the same was issued and has been documented for future reference. Initially calibration was done using celfeine as a standard for 3 times. Analysis of following samples were carried out dynam the training program.

Valedictory function: It was held on 18th March, 2021 at 04.00 pm in the conference hall of Academic Block. All the faculty members and PG scholars of RSBK and DG department attended the function. PG scholars shared their viewe about the training workshop and from their feedback it was evident that the program exceeds their expectations and made them confident on working with HPTLC and its related techniques and method of analysis. Faculty members also provided their feedback. Winners of quiz competition were awarded with trophies and certificate of appreciation. The program ended with distribution of certificates and felicitation of dignitaries followed by vote of thanks.

A report on the Taxonomy workshop organised by Dravyguna department at All India Institute of Ayurveda (AIIA), New Delhi

Taxonomy workshop was organized by Dravyaguna department under the guidance of Prof. Tanuja Manoj Nesari, HOD Dravyaguna & Director, AllA in the Seminar Hall of the AllA, New Delhi from 28th March, 2022 to 29th March, 2022 with enormous enthusiasm. Great response were received from the participants from PG and Ph.D. scholars of Dravyaguna department. Dr. Dinesh Kumar Agrawala, Scientist E, Botanical Survey of India (BSI), India was the Resource Person on both the occasions. Total 21 scholars from Dept. of Dravyaguna attended the workshop. The first day of the course started on 28th March 2022 at 9.00 a.m. with the registration of the candidates.

The workshop was inaugurated by lighting the traditional lamp at the auspicious hands of Respected Director, AllA, Prof Tanuja Manoj Nesari and recitation of "Dhanvantri Vandana". Dr. Meena Deogade (Associate Professor) welcomed and honoured the chief guest with green wealth. The lectures on plant taxonomy commenced with the topic "basic concept of Taxonomy", by Dr. D.K. Agrawala. Electronic copies of the course materials were provided to all the registered candidates, and the electronic copies included the power point presentations on: (1) Taxonomic concepts, (2) Floristic wealth of India, (3) Herbarium methodology, (4) Identification, (6) Morphological characters of selected families- part I, (7) Morphological characters of selected families- part II, (8) Glossary terms of botanical terms.

The theory and practice of identifying plants were discussed with the principles that are involved in the study of classification of organisms. The term 'taxonomy' was coined by A. P. de Candolle in 1813. Several stages of taxonomy were discussed which are Alpha taxonomy, Beta taxonomy and Gamma taxonomy. Followed by, Theories of biological classification that are Artificial Classification, Natural System of Classification, and. Phylogenetic System of Classification. Use of Taxonomic Keys for identifying plants were practiced by students.

On the next day, Resource person along with Dravyaguna department officials, and participants visited the NTPC, New Delhi for plant identification and field observations. After coming back from NTPC hand on training on floral dissection, understanding of plant keys, and description writing were done.

At the end of both days, a session was scheduled for discussion and interactive talks between the candidates and the resource person. The valedictory function was held on 29th March 2022 at 3.00 P.M. The Resource Person, Dr. D.K. Agrawala was felicitated with a memento in gratitude by Prof. P.K. Prajapati (Head, Dept. of Rasashastra & Bhalshajyakalpana, AllA). Both shared their views about the importance of such types of workshops and emphasized on workshop. 


Figure 2 Live demonstration of OCT examination






Figure 1 Lamp lightening by Dr. Anita Ganger




Figure 4 Felicitating to Dr. Anita Ganger


