# **Preface**

It is a matter of great pride for us that, under the guidance of Ministry of AYUSH, year 2017 was marked by great accomplishment & milestones. The First Ever All India Institute of Ayurveda (AIIA), set up along the lines of AIIMS, was dedicated to the Nation by the Honorable Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi on 2<sup>nd</sup> Ayurveda Day on 17<sup>th</sup> October, 2017 at New Delhi. Set up as an apex institute under the Ministry of AYUSH, AIIA is bringing synergy between the traditional wisdom of Ayurveda and modern diagnostic tools and technology. AIIA has also been awarded with NABH Accreditation, therefore becoming the first Ayurveda Hospital in Public Sector to be conferred with NABH accreditation in July, 2017, indicating the quality patient services it is rendering.

AIIA is first of its kind in the country to make use of tools & technology of modern science and modern medicine for scientific validation of fundamental principles and for undertaking R&D, quality control & standardization and safety evaluation of Ayurveda medicines. Interdisciplinary Clinical research and human resource development programs of the institute is helping in capacity building in addressing unmet needs of Ayurveda sector. The Institute initially set-up as an Autonomous registered body of Ministry of AYUSH (Registration No. S-E/93/Distt. South-EAST/2013) fully funded by the Central Government with the objective of raising it to the status of National Importance in next 10 years. All India Institute of Ayurveda, New Delhi, strives hard to improve health status and expand preventive, promotive, curative, palliative and rehabilitative services to large sectors of the society. The clinical services for out patients were initiated in 2014 whereas the academic session commenced from 2016.

AIIA received the approval from Ministry of AYUSH, for the 2<sup>nd</sup>Phase construction including the Residential Quarters for Staff, Hostels for the scholars, Auditorium, International Guest House, State of Art Library, Sports Complex, Pharmacy, Panchakarma Unit etc. in year 2017.

**Vision:** "To be an Outstanding Center of Excellence for Ayurveda Tertiary Health Care and set highest standards of Education, Research and Patient Care through Ayurveda for the benefit of humanity"

**Mission:** Our mission is to be a role model by setting up benchmarks for Postgraduate and Post-Doctoral Education in Ayurveda, bringing Ayurveda Health care of highest standards within the reach of every individual at National and International Level and to undertake interdisciplinary research focused on validation of Ancient Wisdom of Ayurveda using modern tools and technology.

# **Objectives:**

- To provide postgraduate/doctoral and post-doctoral teaching, research facilities and quality patient care services under the Ayurveda system of medicine.
- To act as a referral hospital and a "Centre of Excellence" to set highest standards of education, research, patient care and also function as a model center for international collaboration.
- To act as a model institution to show the strength, efficacy and popularity of Ayurveda. The institute will be used for promoting Ayurveda in India and abroad.



- To provide the services in specialties like Panchakarma, Kayachikitsa, Vata-Vyadhi, Rasayna, Kayakalpa, Twacha roga (Skin disorders), Vajikaran, Shalya Tantra, Kshar evam Anushastra Karma (Jalauka and Rakta Mokshan, Agni Karma etc.), Marma Chiktisa, Vrikka roga (Nephrology), Mutra roga (Urology), Shalkya (Eye, ENT and Dental disorders), Stri Roga and Prasuti Tantra, Bal Roga, Rog Nidan, Lifestyle and Metabolic disorders, Yoga and Swastha Vritta, Ahara Bidhi Vigyan(Dietetics), Ayurvedic Pharmacy, Fundamental Principles of Ayurveda and their application in a set up that combines the ancient tradition of Ayurveda along with the Advantages of biomedicine, current management & information technology tools.
- To impart interdisciplinary post-graduate- doctoral and post-doctoral teaching, training and research in all Ayurvedic specialties and also health and hospital management programmes. It will have all necessary infrastructure to cater to secondary and tertiary level health care facilities for diagnosis and treatment in collaboration with national and international institutions.
- To give highest priority to explore and explain the scientific basis of various aspects of Ayurveda through collaborative, inter-disciplinary research. In this direction the required infrastructure would be developed with the help of various R&D institutions including Central Council for Research in Ayurveda and Siddha (CCRAS), Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR), National Institute for Pharmaceutical Education and Research (NIPER) and other national level institutes. Human resources and infrastructure of participating institutions will be utilized in conducting project-based research programmes on need specific clinical and drug studies.
- To develop model teaching tools, demonstration modules of teaching in Postgraduate/ Doctoral and Post -doctoral Ayurveda Medical education in all branches so as to demonstrate high standards of education for use in Ayurvedic institutions.

In persuance of Vision, Mission and Objectives, AIIA has undertaken intiatives in the following areas during the year 2017-18:

# a) Hospital Services:

- In order to achieve the goal of establishing a State-of-art tertiary care hospital with facilities for clinical research, various Ayurveda Splecialized wings including Panchakarma, Yoga, Diet plan etc. were developed supported with modern laboratory investigations.
- AIIA became the first Institute of Ayurveda under Public sector to become NABH accredited.
- AIIA is also providing OPD & IPD services in 14 specialized areas of Ayurevda along with integration of other AYUSH healthcare services.
- AIIA provides public health outreach programmes through health camps, patient awareness lectures etc. During year 2017-18, 10 (ten) such outreach programmes were conducted by AIIA on thrust areas.
- Approximately 242331 patients in the OPD and 662 patients in IPD were benefitted with Holistic Ayurveda treatment in year 2017-18.
- Various days like International Yoga Day, Cancer Day, Diabetes Day, Asthama Day, Nutrition week, Swachchhata Pakhwada etc. were celebrated with great zeal. Free medical camps, awareness lectures etc. were organized to mark the celebration of these days.



• IEC material and booklets viz. 'Delicacies for Diabetes', 'Common painful conditions and its management through Ayurveda' etc. for patient and public awareness were published by AIIA.

# b) Quality Education:

- At present MD/MS courses in 11 specialties are being offered with intake capacity of 84 seats per year. This courses are affiliated to Delhi University. During the year 2017-18, 111 post graduate scholars were admitted including two batches.
- AIIA aslo conducts short term skill development Certificate courses viz.
  - Panchakarma Technician Course. First batch of Panchakarma Technician Course completed with 100% placement and second batch is ongoing training
  - ➤ Foundation course in Yoga Science for wellness. A batch of 40 candidates completed the training of one-month Foundation course in Yoga Sciences and Wellness organized in collaboration with MDIYN.
  - Certificate course in Hospital Management. Institute has launched the 6 months Certificate Course in Hospital management from mid-January 2018 onwards
- For streamlining the admission process in Postgraduate cources (MD/MS) in AYUSH systems, AIIA was mandated by Ministry of AYUSH to conduct and supervise'All India AYUSH Post Graduate Entrance Test (AIAPGET)' - the first centralized National level Online entrance examination for qualifying PG Entrance in all AYUSH courses. AIIA successfully conducted AIAPGET Exam which was attended by approx. 21,000 students at around 104 centres across the nation
- AIIA alos coordinated HACKATHON activity as entrusted by Ministry of AYUSH
- In this financial year, AIIA also established language lab, National Pharmacovigilance Coordination Centre for ASU&H drugs etc.
- Certain National Protocols for the Management of Diabetes & its Complications, Ante Natal Care were developed by AIIA through conducting brainstorming workshops, Conference, Symposium etc. involving experts from all over the country.
- Various CMEs for other Government Organizations like Rashriya Ayurveda Vidyapeeth. Drug Regulatory board, CME for students of European Academy of Ayurveda, Birstein, Germany were also conducted by AIIA in year 2017-18

### • c) Quality Research:

- AIIA has a separate division namely Translational Research for fostering Quality Research. In all, 111 Research proposals are being supervised by this division in the year 2017-18.
- The Translational Research Division has constituted the Institutional Review Board (IRB) and Institutional Ethics Committee (IEC) as per the WHO& AYUSH Guidelines.
- In the year 2017, the IEC developed the Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for the functioning of IEC and the same has been uploaded on Institute Website. Adhering to these guidelines the Research proposals are approved and supervised.



- To standardize the efficacy and safety measures so as to ensure supply good quality medicine AIIA has developed the Quality Control Laboratories as Central Research Laboratory equipped with preliminary QC instruments and sophisticated equipment viz.
  - > TLC
  - > HPTLC System
  - > HPLC system
  - AAS etc.
- In addition to this, collaborative Researches are ongoing viz.
  - Development and Validation of Prakriti Questionnaire/Scale" with Central Council of Research in Ayurveda Sciences (CCRAS)
  - App for identification of Medicinal Plant by APP with Ministry of HRD/ Ministry of AYUSH under the Hackathon – 2017
  - Games for propagating AYUSH systems of medicines with Ministry of HRD/ Ministry of AYUSH under the Hackathon – 2017
  - Online portal for the submission and real time tracking of grant applications with Ministry of HRD/ Ministry of AYUSH under the Hackathon – 2017
  - Conversion of Ancient Ayurveda measurements into ISI Standards with Ministry of HRD/ Ministry of AYUSH under the Hackathon - 2017

# d) Publications:

- In this financial year, with a view of fostering research through Quality Publications, the publication division of AIIA has taken some concrete steps like releasing of Ayurveda Case Reports (AyuCaRe), an exclusive journal for Case Reports, first of its kind in field of Ayurveda for promoting documentation of case studies
- Besides this, for providing uniform guidelines in management of diseases through Ayurveda, AIIA has released Standard Treatment Guidelines for Diabetes.
- AIIA also publishes the IEC material for creating health awareness in the public, for which 'Delicacies for Diabetes', 'Common painful conditions and its management through Ayurveda' etc. were published in the year 2017-18.
- In the year 2017-18, around 57 Research articles are published by faculty and scholars in different scientific journals.
- e) Collaboration initiatives: It is a matter of pride to report that to promote collaborative research with various R&D institutions at National & International level, several MOU have also been signed between AIIA and premiere institutions during the year 2017-18 viz.
  - a. Morarji Desai National Institute of Yoga (MDNIY) for promoting Yoga related activities
  - b. National Cancer Institute, AIIMS, New Delhi for collaborative research and Integrative management of the cancer patients.
  - c. European Academy of Ayurveda, Birstein, Germany

- f) International Cooperation: In the year 2017-18, around 11 faculty members were deputed /invited at premiere organizations for visiting various countries for establishing International Collaboration & promotion of Ayurveda across the globe. Similarly, distinguished Diplomats & dignitaries of around 10 countries including delegation from NIH USA, WHO Geneva, BIMSTEC countries, Mauritius, Argentina, Korea, US, African Delegation from 11 countries, European Academy of Ayurveda, Germany and many others visited AIIA for demonstration of Strengths of Ayurveda. A CME was also organized by AIIA for the students of European Academy of Ayurveda, Germanyon "Therapeutic Dietetics".

On this occasion, we pay our tribute towards and remain indebted to Late Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayeeji, the former Prime Minister of India, who envisioned AIIA as a dream project which came into reality by the painstaking efforts of many. I convey my sincere thanks to Padmashree Vaidya Rajesh Kotecha, Secretary, Ministry of AYUSHand Sh. Pramod Kumar Pathak, Additional Secretary, Shri PN Ranjit Kumar, Joint Secretary and Shri Roshan Jaggi, Joint Secretary, as well as other authorities of Ministry of AYUSH, New Delhi for providing support and guidance at every step of development & growth of AIIA and providing the Technical support and financial support. # **Important milestones of 2017-18**

1. Dedication of AllA to nation by Hon'ble Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi:
All India Institute of Ayurveda (AllA) has the vision to be an outstanding centerof excellence for Ayurveda tertiary health care, Education and Research for the benefit of humanity. The institute was formally inaugurated and dedicated for service to nation by Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi on the occasion of 2<sup>nd</sup> Ayurveda Day celebrated on Dhanwantari Jayanti (17<sup>th</sup>October, 2017)

The Inauguration ceremony was witnessed by Minister of State (I/c) Shri Shripad Yesso Naik, Ministry of AYUSH, Padmashree Vaidya Rajesh Kotecha, Secretary, Ministry of AYUSH and was graced by many other dignitaries from Ministry of AYUSH, various Government Authorities, Research Councils and more than 2500 Ayurveda practitioners, academicians, researchers and general public gathered all across India. On this occasion, a thematic exhibition of herbs useful for Pain Management, was also inaugurated by Hon'ble Prime Minister.In his address, Prime Minister Narendra Modi appreciated the efforts of Ministry of AYUSH in envisioning AIIA as "Centre of Excellence" in AYUSH and wished for the prosperity of AIIA for its cause.

2. NABH Accreditation: To provide quality service to the patients visiting AllA hospital and to acquaint all the staff of AllA hospital to comply with the quality practice as well as to maintain the continuous quality improvement with emphasis on safety and infection control measures in Hospital, AllA initiated the procedure for NABH accreditation. In its 2<sup>nd</sup> year of its establishment itself, AllA became the first Ayurvedic Government Hospital to get the Coveted status of NABH Accreditation and was granted the NABH accreditation certification on 06<sup>th</sup> July 2017.





- **3. Approval & Sanction of the second phase construction:** In the current financial year, AllA was given the approval of the second phase of its construction. Total constructed area would be approx. 60966 sq.mt. The construction plan has the following salient features
  - Phase II, AIIA, Sarita Vihar would comprise of eight blocks and 3 level basement
  - An auditorium with state of the art facilities having 500 seating capacity
  - AYUSH Sports Complex
  - Pharmacy Unit
  - State of Art Central Library
  - Panchakarma Wing
  - International Guest House
  - Residential Complex
  - Boys and girls hostel etc.
- 4. Center of Integrative Oncology (CIO) and launch of web link: As a joint venture of All India Institute of Ayurveda (AIIA) and National Institute of Cancer Prevention and Research (NICPR), Center of Integrative Oncology (CIO) has been established with an intention of integrative practice in the field of cancer prevention and management. MoU has been signed between AIIA & NICPR in the year 2016. During the celebration of the "Cancer Awareness Week", the website link of CIO was launched by Director, AIIA in Feb, 2018.





- 5. Establishment of National Pharmacovigilance Coordination Centre: Considering negligible number of adverse reactions to ASU & H Drugs in the National Pharmacovigilance Program in India; Ministry of AYUSH initiated a National Level Pharmacovigilance Program for ASU & H drugs with an objective of developing culture of ADR reporting, documentation and analysis for further regulatory action. Ministry of AYUSH has designated All India Institute of Ayurveda, New Delhi as a National Pharmacovigilance Coordination Centre in March, 2018.
- **6. Journal of Ayurveda Case Reports (AyuCaRe):** An exclusive journal for Ayurveda Case Reports is being published by All India Institute of Ayurveda. It invites Case Reports from clinical specialties and provides opportunities for students, researchers and faculty of Ayurveda and allied medical sciences to be part of it. This initiative is expected to play a pivotal role in researches, further generating evidence bases for the claims and principles of Ayurveda and allied sciences in a systematic way. Two issues of AyuCaRe have been published and third issue is in pipeline.



Two volumes of Journal have been released during the reporting period that published case reports on Avascular Necrosis, Ankylosing Spondylitis, Thryoiditis, Frozen Shoulder, Hypothyroidism, Diabetic Retinopathy, Ulcerative Colitis, Bicytopenia, Stroke, Alcoholic Liver Disease, Scceritis.



# II. Graph: Number of OPD Male & Female April-17 To March-2018:







# III. Graph: Number of OPD Patients Kayachikitsa Apr-2017 To March-2018:



# VI. Graph:Number of OPD Patients Panchakarma Apr-2017 To March-2018:




# V. Graph: Number of OPD Patients {Shalakya(ENT)} Apr-2017 To March-2018:






# VI. Graph: Number of OPD Patients (Gynecology) Apr-2017 To March-2018:

# VIII. Graph: Number of OPD Patients (Shalya)Apr-2017 To March-2018:




# IX. Graph: Number of YOGA Patients Apr-2017 To March-2018:






#### **Panchakarma Clincial Services:**

## **Clinical Pathology Laboratory**

All India Institute of Ayurveda has a state of art research and patient care laboratory, which is rapidly growing and adding new technological advancements for patient care and Research. The Clinical Pathology laboratory is situated on the first floor of the hospital and comprises an area of about 800sq. mt. Having four rooms dedicated to Clinical Pathology, Hematology, Biochemistry and Microbiology and the man power of six laboratory technicians and five lab attendants the lab is adding new equipment to each section. The lab is dedicated to patient care and follows the highest standard norms to their service. Quality Control is an important aspect of its functioning.

Dr. Shalini Rai, Assistant Prof., Deptt of Roga Nidana Vikriti Vigyan is the Incharge for Clinical Pathology Laboratory and the services of modern Pathologists, Micro biologists, Radiologists etc. are hired on contract basis.

Nominal rates are charged to the patients facilitating the highest point of tests. The facilities of the laboratories have been made free to the sectors of the society which are below the poverty line. To facilitate the patient care, All India Institute of Ayurveda has entered a Memorandum of Association with a NABL accredited Laboratory which collects the samples for tests not being done in the institute. The laboratory has the expertise of a Consultant Pathologist, Consultant Biochemist and Consultant Microbiologist who provide their expertise to the laboratory and Research work of the scholars. The laboratory presently provides investigations in the hematology section, Biochemistry, ELISA tests, Immuno assay, Clinical Pathology. The microbiology laboratory will also become functional in the near future.



#### **AYUSH Post Graduate Entrance Test 2017 (AIAPGET 2017)**

The All India AYUSH Post Graduate Entrance Test 2017 (AIAPGET 2017) was conducted by All India Institute of Ayurveda (AIIA), New Delhi on behalf of Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India. AIAPGET 2017 was a single window entrance examination for admission to AYUSH MD / MS courses for all AYUSH Colleges / Institutions / University / Deemed University. The examination was held at 101 test centers in about 25 cities on 6<sup>th</sup> August 2017 (Sunday). The examination comprised of 100 Multiple Choice Questions (MCQ) from the respective stream (BAMS / BUMS / BSMS / BHMS) curriculum duly prescribed by CCIM / CCH. Registration and application for appearing in the AIAPGET 2017 examination was undertaken online through website www.aiapget.com, www.aiia.co.in & www.ayush.gov.in

Around 22,037 students from all the four streams registered for AIAPGET 2017 and 21,000 students attended the exam. The results were declared on 24<sup>th</sup> August 2017. A common merit list was prepared and shared it with the concerned authorities/states who prepared their own merit list considering the applicable rules, regulations, reservation policy and other criteria for the counselling.

• Development of Pharmacognosy Lab: In the series of developing Dravyaguna Laboratory of AIIA, in accordance with the norms of an adequate laboratory suitable for various scientific procedures like microscopic-macroscopic study of fresh plants and crude drugs, phytochemical studies, constituent study, plant identification, adulteration studies etc., the lab has been made sophisticated with number of chemicals like Safranine stain, Glycerine, Iodine, HCl, H<sub>2</sub>SO<sub>4</sub> etc. A number of laboratory instruments and glasswares have also been brought in to carry out constituent studies and identification studies. A field press for safe and proper preservation of collected plant samples is available in laboratory. A soxhlet apparatus has also been established in the laboratory for Hot Extraction.

These included from HODs of prestigious institutions, experienced practitioners to retired Professors. The inauguration of the workshop on 19<sup>th</sup> February 9.30am, was graced by the Guest of Honour, Resp. Shri PN Ranjit Kumar, Joint Secretary, Ministry of AYUSH in presence of the Chief Guest Dr. Manoj Nesari, Advisor, Ministry of AYUSH, Honourable Director AllA, Prof. (Dr.) Tanuja Nesari, and Dean Prof. (Dr.) P.K. Prajapati, invited subject experts, faculty & P.G. Scholars AllA.

3. 3. Group III – 3<sup>rd</sup> Trimester., Examination, Investigations, Month wise regimen medication, Pathyapathya, Yogasanas, Panchkarma, vaccination, and trimester wise minor ailment treatment.

Rigorous exercise in the form of discussions and exchange of practical experiences was done and after tirelessly working day & night the draft Protocol was prepared.

To incorporate all new thoughts on this topic Poster Session was organized for PG Scholars of various departments of All India Institute of Ayurveda in which participants took part with great enthusiasm and different aspects of the Preconceptional & Prenatal care were highlighted. The session was judged by eminent judges to choose three best posters.

# Training Program for ASU & H Drug Regulators, Industry Personnel and Other Stakeholders

Quality, Safety and Efficacy are the essential aspects and equally applicable to Drug Manufacturing agencies. There is a need to update developments in the direction of regulatory provisions to the personnel involved in the drug manufacturing. Considering this; Ministry of AYUSH initiated comprehensive training programs and six such events throughout the country were conducted in between January to March 2018. The event at New Delhi was organized during 22-23 February 2018.

Pharmacovigilance is the science dedicated to reduce the risk of drug-related harms to patients. # Pharmacovigilance for Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani & Homoeopathy Drugs

Success of any healthcare system always depends upon the availability, authenticity and safety levels of the suitable drugs. In one word it can be said that all healthcare services will get paralyzed without authentic, pure, potent and safe drugs.

It is a popular perception that, Herbal of herbal origin doesn't produce any adverse effects. The utilization of these drugs since thousands of years also supports this notion. Safety, efficacy depends upon the methods of judicious application of the dugs after thorough examination of various factors ranging from the age, constitution, condition of the patient, chronicity of the disease, nature of the drug etc. This is equally applicable to the medicines of traditional systems.

Improvement of patient safety is gaining momentum worldwide. Looking into the current concerns on traditional systems of medicine; a system of safety monitoring or documenting the unintended reactions to ASU & H Drugs is required. Pharmacovigilance is the science dedicated to reduce the risk of drug related harms to the patients. Considering negligible number of adverse reactions to ASU & H Drugs in the National Pharmacovigilance Program in India; Ministry of AYUSH has initiated a National Level Pharmacovigilance Program for ASU & H drugs with an objective of developing culture of ADR reporting, documentation and analysis for further regulatory action.

The purpose of the initiative is to collect, collate and analyse data related to adverse drugs reactions with the administration of ASU & H drugs thus to establish evidence clinical safety of these drugs in a scientific manner. Besides this; it is also proposed to undertake surveillance of advertisements of ASU & H drugs in this program.

#### The scheme aims at

- i. Inculcating reporting culture among the consumers as well as ASU & H practitioners to facilitate documentation of ADRs
- ii. Developing system-wise database of ADRs
- iii. Evolving evidence based recommendations regarding the clinical safety of ASU & H Drugs
- iv. Inculcating reporting of misleading advertisements of ASU & H drugs

In this initiative, a three tier mechanism is adopted. There will be national, intermediary and peripheral pharmacovigilance centres.

- 1. *National Pharmacovigilance Coordination Centre*: All India Institute of Ayurveda, New Delhi
- 2. *Intermediary Pharmacovigilance Centres*: Respective National Institutes have been identified as system-wise Intermediary Centres.

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## **Quality Control Lab**

All India Institute of Ayurveda is a premier institute under the aegis of Ministry of AYUSH and has a national status. As such the institute is taking long strides towards achieving excellence in every aspect of Ayurvedic field be it clinical, research or academic. With the tremendous increase in the global use of Ayurvedic medicines, several concerns regarding their efficacy and safety have also been raised. Hence it has become necessary to standardize the efficacy and safety measures so as to ensure supply good quality medicine. Taking in account the recent responsesmaligning the Ayurvedic medicines, quality control has become a prerequisite.

Presently medicinal requirement for OPD and IPD patients is sourced through government pharmacies. AllA is in the process of establishing its own manufacturing unit. The mediciens are being dispensed through the pharmacy unit. A robust QC lab becomes necessary to maintain the quality check for supplied medicines as well to deal will the consumer complaints for quality assurance.

Further, in future, this quality control lab with all its constituent units having state of the art facilities will also serve as a focal centre for facilitating analytical assistance to Ayurvedic researchers all over India. Dr. Pramod R. Yadav, Assistant Professor, Deptt of Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana, is Incharge for the QC Labs.

Presently, the place allotted for Quality control lab is situated on second floor of academic building. Two rooms are allotted for the lab. These rooms are equipped with preliminary QC instruments and equipments viz.:

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the accounts of the All India Institute of Ayurveda for the year ended 31 March 2018.

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of the All India Institute of Ayurveda (Institute) as at 31 March 2018, the Income & Expenditure Accounts and Receipts & Payments Accounts for the year ended on that date under Section 20(1) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971. The audit has been entrusted upto the year 2021-22. These financial statements are the responsibility of management of the Institute. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

- 2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/CAG'S Audit Reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provided a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- Based on our audit, we report that:
- We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;
- The BalanceSheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the common format approved by the Ministry of Finance.
- iii. In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Instituteus required in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- iv. We further report that:



### A Balance Sheet

### A.1 Assets

### A.1.1 Fixed Assets (Schedule - 3) - ₹22,56 lakh

A.1.1.1M/o H&FW entered into an agreement (April 2008) with M/s HSCC Ltd. (consultant) for providing consulting services for construction of building and procurement of equipment/forniture for the Institute. Institute has started using this building from May 2015. As on 31.03.2018, Ministry/Institute paid an amount of ₹140.38 crore to the consultant. Out of which, consultant had already incurred expenditure of ₹120.02 crore for construction of building and procurement of furniture and equipment. However, it is observed that Institute had not included above assets in its accounts. This resulted in understatement of Fixed Assets/Work-in-progress and Current Assets, Loans and Advances by ₹120.02 and ₹20.36 crore, respectively and also understatement of Corpus/Capital Fund by ₹140.38 crore.

A.1.1.2 During the year 2017-18, Institute had purchased equipment and furniture items worth ₹9.21 lakh. However, these items were not accounted for under Fixed Assets and charged as expenditure. This has resulted in understatement of Fixed Assets and overstatement of expenditure by like amount.

### B. Income & Expenditure Accounts

B.1 Income From User Charges/Examination Fee- (Schedule-5)-Rs.4.00 crore

During the year 2017-18, Institute had received Caution Money, Vendor Earnest Money

Deposit (EMD) and Security Deposit (SD) amounting to ₹13.06 lakh from the Vendors,
students of Post Graduate Scholars, Hospital Management Courses and Panchakarma

Technicians. Though, the caution money/EMD/SD was refundable to the vendors/students
after completion of course/assignment, it was not disclosed as liability in the 'Schedule 2

(Current Liabilities & Provisions)' of the annual accounts of the Institute. This has resulted in
overstatement of Income and understatement of Liabilities by ₹13.06 lakh.

### C. General

C.1 As per note no. 8(iii) of Notes on Accounts, there is a deviation of ₹27.10 erore and ₹1.66 erorein opening balances of cash and cash equivalent. This difference of 28.76 erore has been disclosed in Schedule - 1 under the head 'Opening Balance Difference Adjusted'. However, this amount should be appropriately depicted in the respective heads of accounts. In view of the above, we are not able to form an opinion on the correctness of the figure shown as 'Opening Balance Difference Adjusted'.



- C.2 The Institute had disclosed advances of ₹24,43 crore under the head 'AIIA Contingent Advance'in the 'Schedule 4B- Loan & Advances' of the annual accounts. The details of advances were not provided to audit by the Institute therefore figures could not be verified by audit.
- C.3 The provision of retirement benefits has not been made in the accounts on actuarial basis as required under Accounting Standard (AS-15) of ICAL.
- C.4 The Institute had received "Grant for Pharmacovigilance Initiative (ASU Drugs)" of ₹1.5 crore shown under "Schedule 1A - Earmarked/Endowment/Other Funds' in which ₹3.48 lakh was utilized during 2017-18. The details regarding expenditure on ASU Drugs was not provided to audit by the Institute therefore this could not be verified by audit.
- C.5 As per Schedule 10 (Significant Accounting Policies), the annual accounts of the Institute were prepared on cash basis, which was in contravention of the uniform format of accounts.
- C.6 Institute had shown each in hand of ₹ 95000/- in the Receipt & Payment Account. However, as per petty each book the each in hand (Imprest) was ₹ 75000/-. The difference needs to be reconciled.
- C.7 The ownership of the land on which the Institute building was constructed lies with the Ministry. A disclosure to this effect should be incorporated in the Notes on accounts.
- C.8 The Institute was registered on 23.08.2013 under Society Registration Act XXI of 1860, Registration No. S-E/93/District-South-East/2013. The Accounts/Balance Sheet of Institute were prepared/compiled by Central Council for Research in Ayurvedic Sciences till 2016-17. In 2017-18, the Institute had prepared its first independent Annual Accounts. A disclosure to this effect should have been incorporated in the Notes on accounts.

### D. Grant-in-aid

The Institute received Grants-in-aid of ₹29.45 crore during 2017-18. The Institute had an unutilized balance of ₹31.26 crore of the previous years. The Council had incurred an expenditure of ₹36.28 crore leaving an un-utilized balance of ₹24.43 crore as on 31 March 2018.

### E. Management Letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of management of Institute through a management letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.



- v. Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- vi. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, because of the effects of the observations discussed above in the comment nos.

  A.1.1.1 and C.1, the financial statements, read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report, do not give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India
  - a. In so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet of the state of affairs of the All India Institute of Ayurveda as at 31 March 2018 and
  - b. In so far as it relates to Income & Expenditure Account of the deficit for the year ended on that date.
